# What is our Vision for the Future?

Initiatives such as our new Maternal Pathways Program help us better support youth through direct care, community partnership, and systems change. Expansions to our education and employment programs, including enhanced assessments, job training, tutoring, and institutional and corporate partnerships, better prepare our youth for stable careers, and ultimately economic mobility. And finally, improving our capacity to address mental health challenges and expanding access to trauma-informed mental health assessment and treatment helps our youth heal and overcome many of the debilitating challenges they face on their road to recovery.


We are also called to ask challenging questions as we work to end youth homelessness altogether - why does a young person arrive at our door in the first place? This calls to mind the words of Desmond Tutu: "There comes a point where we need to stop just pulling people out of the river. We need to go upstream and find out why they are falling in."

#### **SPRING REPORT 2022**



Pregnant people in our care face numerous obstacles and barriers to their well-being. Research shows much of the disparity in pregnancy outcomes is caused by factors related to racism, socioeconomic status, maternal education, health insurance coverage, and access to prenatal and infant health services. This Spring, we are starting a Maternal Pathways Program. Our interventions will be the first step in addressing long-standing inequities related to social determinants of health, such as economic stability, education, community, environment, and healthcare access.
